MEETING MINUTES

TPG April 2012 Business Meeting

President Jo Ellen Westmoreland welcomed returning members, new members, and guests.

Minutes: Recording Secretary Neal O'Briant thanked Joanne Wood for taking minutes at the March meeting. He announced one correction in the spelling of Maureen McGregor's name. He asked for any other corrections. Minutes were approved with the one correction.

President's Report: Jo Ellen Westmoreland said that members would receive a copy of the proposed amended bylaws and constitution the following week in order to have a vote at the May meeting. The guild will also be electing new officers at the May meeting. Jo Ellen said a Mayco representative would be in the area in May and there might be an opportunity to host a free workshop on underglazes. Details will be announced later. She also said there were T-shirts available for sale.

Librarian's Report: Jo Ellen reported for librarian Christina Sydor that purchases were made based on suggestions from guild members. Jo

Ellen also encouraged members to return book and videos.

Corresponding Secretary's Report: Joanne Wood reported that she had been sending out notices and that she would send the bylaws and constitution. She is investigating a change of email address for the guild from the Yahoo account.

Treasurer's Report: Elise Stiles reported that there are 99 members. She reported that the Ben Owen workshop took in more than we spent.

Webmaster's Report: Gail Lawson was absent.

Refreshments: Jo Ellen thanked Kathy Rogers for bringing refreshments to the meeting.

Planet Earth: Coordinator Effie Watson reported that she had submitted everything for the guild members participating in the Planet Earth event on April 21. She will be sending out information about the day to the participants. She thinks setup may begin as early as 6:30 a.m. in order to start at 8 a.m.

Artspllosure: Coordinator Jimmy Sodano reported that the dates for Artspllosure are May 19-20. The guild will have a 30x40 tent again. He passed around signup sheets for work assignments. He asked for two volunteers to share a space so that everyone who signed up could participate.

Announcements: Jo Ellen thanked Effie and Jimmy for coordinating these events.

Kathy Rogers said she had cards available with info for an upcoming show.

Conrad Weiser brought a laptop with a slideshow of photos from the recent NCECA in Seattle.

Jo Ellen announced that there was still space in Conrad's raku workshop at the Crafts Center.

Angie Williams announced an Artists for Animals Faire taking place April 21 at Cloer Family Vineyards in Apex.

Vice President's Report and Speaker: Jimmy Sodano announced the May meeting is planned to be held at Pullen Park. TPG members are invited to bring a covered dish and a pot valued at about \$15 for a pottery exchange. In case of rain, this meeting will be moved to the Craft Center. Details will be sent prior to the meeting.

Jimmy introduced Frank Neef, who talked about his history as a potter. Frank brought maps of Seagrove

pottery and his own cards to pass out. He also passed out a handout on crystalline glazes. He demonstrated by throwing a large platter/bowl and two large vases. He brought several leather hard vases to demonstrate his carving techniques. He sketches the design in pencil before carving with an X-acto knife. Frank also demonstrated how he makes a melon vase using the straight edge of a piece of wood and then the edge of a pony roller. He brought many of his beautiful pieces with various crystalline glazes.

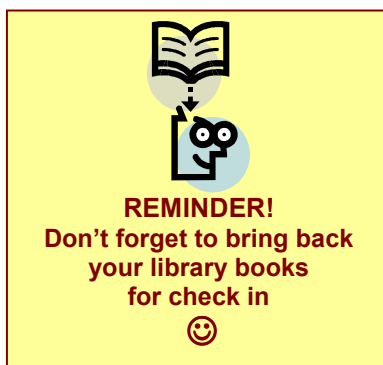
Participants will bring bisque to be glazed on Friday night and fired Saturday. The kiln opens Sunday!
