Pottery - Cone 6 Reduction Firing Workshop with Ronan Kyle Peterson

Please register for this workshop at least 7 days in advance.

In this workshop, we will explore the world of reduction firing, which is geared towards introducing the less common target temperature of cone 6. Firing to cone 6 in reduction (as opposed to the cone 9 - 10 temperature goal) offers many positive possibilities. Cone 10 glazes such as shinos, celadons, and temokus come out great with very little difference. In studios that fire to cone 6 in oxidizing electric kilns, there is already a large palette to fire in a reduction firing which yields different and very often exciting results. In studios geared towards cone 6 electric firing, adding a cone 6 reduction option actually simplifies the studio's glaze palette and clay body needs. Basic glaze chemistry will be discussed, as well as different approaches and techniques for glaze application.

The workshop will last over two weekends. Students bring bisqueware to the September 18 meeting and have the two weeks in between to glaze and prepare their work for the October 1 firing.

This weekend workshop will consist of creating various styles of teapots, teabowls and cups while also examining the nuances of functionality. The design of these functional elements will be based on the premise that they are enticing to the eve, vet at the same time be ergonomically designed. Jamie Kirkpatrick will also demonstrate an intense manipulation of the form while on the wheel and incorporate this into the teapots form. This altering of form will be assisted by the use of dry throwing techniques and heat gun. We will explore and discuss ways of personalizing

your work to make it extraordinarily and uniquely yours.

Jamie Kirkpatrick will be demonstrating at an advanced level and will discuss materials used, including slips and glazes, as well as personal firing techniques.

MEETING MINUTES TPG May 2010 Business Meeting

The Triangle Potters Guild met Tuesday, May 4, 2010, in the NCSU Crafts Center. President Alice DeLisle welcomed returning members, new members, and visitors.

- The minutes from April were approved as printed in the newsletter.
- Charlene Poisel gave information on the guild's participation with Urban Ministries' Stone Soup Supper and announced the date for this year's event: November 16 at First Baptist Church on Edenton Street. She said that Donna Kanich, who has led this event for the guild, would like someone to assist her this year. Danita Morgan, the new development officer for Urban Ministries, thanked the guild members for participating over the years.
- Bill Schmidt presented the library report on behalf of Nancy Schecter. There was one new DVD: Joyce Michaud's Hand Thrown: East Asian Wedged Coil Technique.
- Lauren Brockman presented the treasurer's report, saying that we ended the year with 84 members and were on budget for the year. The Finance Committee had approved making a \$250 per year donation to the NCSU Crafts Center discretionary funds. The proposal was put to the membership and approved.
- Jo Ellen Westmoreland reported that the Workshop Committee has met and narrowed the list of presenters down to 12. The committee sent emails to evaluate the presenters to see if any of them met the guild's needs in terms of timeframe and price.
- Martin Stankus reported that TPG sales for the Planet Earth Celebration on April 17 were

around \$1,000. He reported that the planning for Artsplosure was going well, but we still need people to staff the payment table on Saturday afternoon. The dates for Artsplosure are May 15 and 16.

- Johanna New reported on the guild's possible participation under the N.C. pottery tent at this year's N.C. State Fair. She had talked with Kenneth Nelson, one of the owners of DK Clay, which sponsors the tent. He said the guild members could share two shelves. She did not have details on the commission rate that would be deducted from sales.
- Alice DeLisle talked about adding the webmaster as an ad hoc board member position for which the membership dues would be waived. Lauren Brockman made a motion, which was seconded and passed.
- Charlene Poisel, chair of the Nominating Committee, presented the slate of officers for the new year (beginning in September):

- Librarian: Christina SydorA motion was made to accept
- A motion was made to accept the slate of officers as nominated and the motion passed. Charlene thanked outgoing board members for their service. Alice DeLisle mentioned that several members had served as ad hoc members on the board. She thanked Carol Clark, Charlene Poisel, and Cheryl Weisz for their service.
- Vice President JoEllen Westmoreland thanked guild members who had participated in the Crafts Center display. The TPG show runs through

June 13. Members can pick up pieces after that date.

- Nancy Schecter brought delicious refreshments.
- Program:
 - Warner Hyde, Assistant Professor of Art at Meredith, presented slides of influences on his work, the process, kilns, and pieces. He demonstrated throwing a large platter using native clay. He included porcelain shavings, a deer skull, high iron clay scraps, and broken glass.
