Tom Turner Two Day Demo Workshop

Tom Turner is conducting a two day demonstration workshop at the Renaissance Hotel in downtown Asheville on June 26 and 27, 2010.

The two day workshop will start with visual images that cover 45 years of his pottery, glazes, and kilns; then a discussion of "what is porcelain"; and then he will demonstrate wedging, kneading, throwing, designing, trimming, decoration, simple glaze testing, with discussions about firing. The first day will be making pots and the second day will be trimming, decorating, and finishing.

MEETING MINUTES

MARCH 2, 2010 TPG
BUSINESS MEETING

Jo Ellen Westmoreland opened the meeting and welcomed returning members, new members, and visitors. Alice DeLisle was unable to attend.

A. Feb. 2010 minutes were amended as requested by Neal O'Briant. Charlene Poisel had won the Urban Ministries participation lottery, and gave up the prize because she had won it in 2009. Neal O'Briant won the second pick.. The minutes were voted on and approved.

B. Library report: Nancy Schecter had not purchased any books in the previous month. She has \$220 left in the library budget, and is open to suggestions for books or CD's to purchase

C. Treasurer's report: Lauren Brockman reported we have 81 members and about \$2,800 in our bank account. The budget is right on target.

D. Workshop committee: Edge Barnes spoke for Donna Kanich. He passed around a suggestion sheet, seeking suggested names of presenters for a workshop next year.

E. Nominating Committee: Al Headen spoke for Charlene Poisel. The 2010-11 possible slate of officers is as follows: Jo Ellen Westmoreland, President; Susan Luster, Vice-President; Joanne Wood, Corresponding Secretary; Neal O'Briant, Recording Secretary; Christine Sydor, Librarian. Anyone wishing to volunteer may still do so. The final slate will be announced in April, and voted on at the May meeting.

F. Planet Earth Celebrations, April 17. Martin Stankus reported that 5 people were interested in participating and selling. He will help them coordinate shelving and other details, but will be personally unable to attend the event.

G. ArtSplosure, May 15 & 16. Martin Stankus had a sign-up sheet for people to register and pay their \$25 fee. There will be sales and demos, and he also had sheets to sign up for volunteer jobs. All sales participants must also volunteer. In the case of more participant sign-ups than there are spaces available, a lottery will be held.

H. April meeting refreshments will be supplied by Neal O'Briant.

I. Vice President's Update: Jo Ellen Westmoreland reminded the guild of the upcoming TPG show in the windows of the Crafts Center, beginning on April 14. Members may enter 1-3 pieces, and bring them to the April meeting, or drop them off at the Crafts Center before that time. Window dimensions are 15" high, 10" deep, and 20" wide. Those needing stands should bring their own. The April and May meetings are not yet scheduled. April may possibly be a photographer to discuss photographing art work and upgrading our website photos.

J. New business: The new artist co-op on Franklin St. in Chapel Hill will be opening on April 14. Meeting was adjourned. The night's presenter, Blain Avery, was introduced. He showed slides and demonstrated some of his decorating techniques.
