December Program: Holiday Raku/Potluck

Our December meeting will be a raku Saturday, December 8, at Conrad Weiser's. We'll be joined by members of the ClayWorks Guild. The raku firing will start at noon and eating around 3 p.m. Conrad will be making the famous Brita Tate gløgg.

Everyone who wants to fire should bring no more than two bisqued pots. Raku glazes will be available if you do not have your own glazes. Glaze ahead of time if you can to save time.

Directions:

From Raleigh and Chapel Hill, take I-40 to the Jordan Lake exit (Hwy. 751 or Hope Valley Road). Turn right (or left), drive north, approx. 3.5 miles (passing a lot of streets with names evoking British places and the golf course on both sides of Hope Valley Road), looking for Brighton Road on the right. Turn, go one block then turn right on to Hamstead Court. Conrad's house is at the top of the second hill—on the right. (Look for a double mailbox with a teapot hanging underneath.)

From Durham: Drive south on Hope Valley Road (Hwy. 751), cross Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd., past Reynolds and look for Brighton Road on the left. Go left on to Brighton for one block and there is Hamstead Court. Conrad's house is at the top of the second hill on the right.

Please park on the shoulders of the street, since the driveway will be filled with potters. Conrad's phone number is 919-490-1985 if you need to call.

Meeting Minutes, November 6, 2012

The December meeting will take the form of a gløgg and raku party to be held at Conrad Weiser's house on December 8. Members were invited to come at noon if they would like to fire a pot or otherwise at mid-afternoon to eat. A list was passed for a food sign up.

• Sculpting a Portrait in Clay: This eight-session workshop starting January 14, 2013, will provide basic instruction on using photos and working with a model to complete a realistic clay portrait of the human head. From building an armature to applying finishing touches, sculpting techniques will be emphasized in a step-by-step process to complete an anatomically correct portrait and lifelike representation of the human head. This workshop is appropriate for beginners as well as experienced artists.

From Chris Campbell

Chris Campbell will be teaching a workshop titled "Colored Clay Revolution" at Claymakers in Durham April 27 & 28, 2013. Judith Skinner discovered a quick and easy way to blend colored polymer clays and Chris has adapted her techniques to our earthen clays. During this two day hands on workshop you will learn how to custom

color your clay, how to blend secondary colors to create a rainbow of hues. The resulting clays can be used in throwing, hand building, slip work and surface decoration. All levels of potters will enjoy this workshop.

For those of you with free time in February, Chris will be teaching a weeklong course at the John Campbell Folk School in Brasstown, February 10–16, 2013.

Chris's work and these new color blending techniques will also be featured in the January 2013 issue of *Pottery Making Illustrated*.
