Since 2007, she has been a Pottery Instructor at the Art Factory in Ann Arbor Michigan, the Pullen Arts Center in Raleigh, and has taught for the Durham Arts Council, and Claymakers. She is the owner of Trout Ceramics and operates a home studio in Durham. Laura's work has been shown in many galleries in the Ann Arbor/Detroit area in Michigan. Pumpkins! Thursday, September 11th 7-9pm

We are going to be making pumpkins for Fall! Whether you like handbuilding or wheel throwing, come and make a Fall pumpkin for yourself or someone else! I will be demonstrating thrown pumpkins and pumpkin canisters. We will discuss Fall pumpkin colors and will have a special cone 6 orange glaze while supplies last! As always, Studio Socials are free to Pullen members and current students! Pumpkin Pie will be served.

Carbon Trap Workshop with Lou Raye Nichol

October 4, November 8, 13 and 15

Carbon trapping happens when the kiln is made very smoky at a certain stage in the firing, and the glazes are formulated to capture the carbon from that smoke.

This can produce a number of accidental results. There is a magic in opening a kiln full of surprises. It can be disappointing, of course. A kiln opening can be Christmas or Halloween!

If the glaze traps no carbon, it is a bright orange (or white depending on the formula). Where it does trap carbon it can move between black, creamy, or grey - or a mixture of all of these.

In this hands-on workshop, Lou Raye Nichol will be sharing with us her techniques for successful carbon trap. The workshop will be broken up into 4 parts:

Saturday, October 4 - Informational Session 1-3pm

(October 4 - November 7 time to produce pieces)

Saturday, November 8 - Glazing Session 1-3pm

Thursday, November 13 - Fire Kiln

Saturday, November 15 - Kiln opening and discussion 1-3pm

The cost is \$120 for Raleigh residents and \$135 for non-residents which includes one bag of clay. This workshop is appropriate for intermediate and advanced potters. You must be able to attend the October 4th and November 8th sessions in order to sign up and participate in this workshop.
