# **Minutes from February 2017**

Triangle Potters General Membership Meeting Minutes February 7, 2017

President Elena Ceberio called the meeting to order.

## **Raleigh Urban Ministries:**

They provided snacks for the meeting.

Thank you messages to donors. A few emails were missing and group was asked to pass on thank you letters to these donors, if possible Dr. Peter Morris talked about recent Stone Soup and the photos he had taken of attendees gathering around bowl tables. The event raised a record \$60,000 this year. They need to raise about \$2,000,000 a year. Stone Soup helps raise awareness for Urban Ministries and thus plays a bigger role than the amount raised. It also helps with their large volunteer community.

Carol Schwartz who organizes Stone Soup was introduced.

Gary Fuquay won the drawing for \$100 gift certificate to Highwater Clay. (TPG members are eligible for a chance to win for every 5 pots donated).

Request for a coordinator for next year event was made and their role described. Nancy Fowler has agreed to coordinate for 2017.

Lauren Brockman spoke about creative ways to generate bowls for next year, including throwing parties. An email will be sent so that members can indicate what they can host and people can volunteer to attend.

# Officers Reports:
