Can You Make Oyster Shells?

Pearlita Foods, based in Raleigh, is looking for local ceramic artists to create oyster shells for company tastings. They can be realistic or your artistic interpretation of a shell. The world's first oyster alternative company, Pearlita makes plant-based oysters that look like real oysters, but are sustainable and nutritious. www.pearlitafoods.com

"Our ultimate goal is to remove all reliance on animals," says Kassondra Hickey, Head of Science with Pearlita. "One of our products is a plant-based oyster and in order to make it animal-free we need to serve it in reusable ceramic shells.... "We came up with a super cool idea to find local ceramic artists to help design beautiful, reusable shells," she adds. "Our intention is for restaurants to buy our products by visualizing how it can be served and redefining the experience.... We also hope it will bring attention to

the artists work!"
