## **November Program: Geoffrey Lloyd**

#### Artist Statement

I see my work as a continually evolving process of refinement, developing new ideas from those things that I encounter that really speak to me. Given the amazing variety of shape, color, materials, techniques, and other choices that are available to the studio potter, it is inevitable that the artist's work is a synthesis of all influences into an expression of their own unique tastes and experiences. My work is no exception; from the use of porcelain as my primary medium, to the ash glazes inspired by my work with wood fired kilns and their connection to the origins of glaze development, my work is heavily influenced by my own experience and surroundings.

I strive to blend elements of the ancient aesthetic roots of pottery with the more refined contemporary elements of form and finish to produce a line of work that is both uniquely appealing and completely functional. It is my hope that you are drawn by the details and handcrafted beauty of my work and that you will soon grow to appreciate just how sturdy and functional it is as well.

All work is made of English grolleg porcelain, layered with combinations including wood ash, micro-crystalline, and copper red glazes, then fired to a temperature of approximately 2450 degrees Fahrenheit, making it much more durable than mass produced ware. Everything I make is also food safe and suited for use in the oven, microwave, and dishwasher.

Treasurer: Budget for 2015-2016: Eric was absent but his budget proposal was handed out to all members for review, to be voted on at the next meeting. Name tags of members who have not yet paid their dues have a sticker to that effect, dues are due by the November meeting for full TPG benefits.

Library: Joanne purchased a new DVD for us: Layered Surfaces by Erin Furminsky. Already checked out!

Aprons: about 25 are still available for purchase at \$5 each (not \$10 as Nancy mistakenly said!), text or call Nancy at 919-272-7711 if you want one.

Empty Bowls/Stone Soup, the Urban Ministries' fundraiser for which we provide pottery: Thanks for donating pots! Keep them coming! Please try to bring them by the next meeting Nov. 3, though the absolute final collection date is Wed. Nov. 11 (Stone Soup is Nov. 12). Donation pots are not limited to bowls, no seconds or fragile pots, not too large so they can be safely stored in boxes. Bring them to the Crafts Center, or to Pullen, Sertoma or Cary Arts Centers. TPG members get a slip in the drawing for a \$100 Highwater Clay gift certificate, for every 5 pots donated. Nancy reports we have about 360 so far, need about 200 more, since this year every patron attending will get a pot for a donation. Pullen Park renovation: Patrick Beggs reminds us the first public meeting about this is Tues. Oct. 13 at Theater in the Park (at Pullen Park).

Linda introduced the speaker, Joseph Sand. He opened with a slide show of building his huge salt kiln in Randleman NC five years ago, where he fires gigantic (and other) pots. Lately he's doing exciting clay sculptures. He demonstrated his stiff slab hand building technique featuring rough scoring with a fork, plain distilled vinegar, and hard Sherrill ribs. Then he showed how he adds coils to a thrown pot base, to make huge pots. He learned this technique as Mark Hewitt's apprentice. It was a fascinating presentation!
