Carbon Trap Firing Open Studio!

Join us for another adventure in carbon trapping! Carbon trapping happens when the kiln is made very smoky at a certain stage of the firing, and the glazes are formulated to capture the carbon from that smoke. This can produce a number of accidental results. There is a magic in opening a kiln full of surprises. It can be disappointing, of course. A kiln opening can be Christmas or Halloween! If the glaze traps no carbon, it is a bright orange or white. Where it does trap carbon, it can move among black, creamy and gray - or a mixture of these.
