In June 2022, she completed an MFA in Ceramics with Collegiate Teaching Certification at Rhode Island School of Design, where she concentrated on ceramic sculpture, decorative techniques, visual storytelling, and inclusive teaching practices. Now graduated, they are excited to return to a more intimate practice of creating intricately decorated functional ceramics while teaching classes at Cary Arts Center and Pullen Arts Center.

Presentation: Decorative Inlay Sampler Kalee will demonstrate a sampling of her favorite inly-based decorative techniques, including how to inlay nerikomi on a wheel-thrown piece and how to inlay colored slip into carved drawings using wax resist.
